- Hebrews: the name by which the Jewish people were first known
- Monotheism: The Belief in only one God.
- Polytheism: The belief in many gods.
- Covenant: A binding promise between two people.
- Canaan: The land the Hebrews moved to.
- Famine: A long period of time with no food or water.
- Israelites: The families of the Hebrew tribes.
- Plague: A terrible disaster.
- Exodus: a long journey from one place to another.
- Passover: The holiday celebrating the Jews' escape from Egypt.


Who was Abraham?

• The first JEWS were known as the HEBREWS.

(1-3)

- ABRAHAM was the first Hebrew. He was most likely born in MESOPOTAMIA in about 2000 BC
- Mesopotamians believed in many gods; Abraham believed in only ONE GOD; this is called monotheism.
- Abraham claimed God spoke to him and told him to leave Mesopotamia for a place called CANAAN
- These stories were recorded in the Bible








- After reaching the land of Canaan with his family, the Bible says God made a COVENANT with Abraham
- God promised that the land would always belong to Abraham's family if Abraham would continue to WORSHIP him.
- One of Abraham's sons was called ISAAC, through him came the Jewish descendents

Why did the Israelites move to Egypt?

- Abraham's son Isaac had a child named JACOB, who would later be called ISRAEL, he had 12 sons
- Jacob's favorite son was named JOSEPH, his other sons became jealous because Jacob made a beautiful coat for Joseph
- Joseph's brothers sold him into EGYPT and told their father he had been killed







(6-7)

• JOSEPH lived in Egypt for a long time, he was very well respected and rose to POWER

(8-9)

- Soon he was second in authority, only the pharaoh had more power than him
- FAMINE struck in Canaan, forcing Jacob and his sons (who all had large families of their own by now)to move to Egypt for food.
- Joseph was reunited with his BROTHERS, and they all settled in EGYPT



He forgave his brother

(10)

- The **ISRAELITES** lived in Egypt for many years
- They grew and had LARGE families
- Soon a new PHARAOH came to power, he was afraid the Israelites would become powerful and try to overthrow him, so he made them SLAVES

How did the Israelites leave Egypt?

 The pharaoh was afraid the Israelites might overthrow the Egyptians, so he had all the ISRAELITE baby BOYS thrown in the Nile and DROWNED

(11)

- One mother sent her son, **MOSES**, down the Nile in a basket. He **SURVIVED**. The pharaoh's daughter found him and raised him as her own.
- The pharaoh's daughter had an Israelite women help her raise Moses, he learned early on that he was an Israelite







(12-13)

- The Bible says that when MOSES grew up God told him to demand FREEDOM for the Israelites
- The pharaoh refused, so God sent **TEN PLAGUES** to torment the Egyptians, including turning the Nile to blood, hail, and swarms of insects
- The Pharaoh did not respond to the first nine plagues, so a tenth plague was sent, God killed the firstborn son of all the Egyptians
- The pharaoh finally allowed the ISRAELITES to go FREE



What was the Passover?

- It was about 1225 BC when the Israelites left Egypt, this was known as the EXODUS
- They travelled along the Red Sea, back towards the land of **CANAAN**, they wandered for 40 years
- The Bible says that God again spoke to MOSES at Mount Sinai, here he received the TEN COMMANDMENTS, these were a set of laws to live by.





"Honor thy father and thy mother" •"Thou shalt not murder" "Thou shalt not steal" "Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor"

- Today the Jewish people celebrate the night they ESCAPED from EGYPT
- According to the bible, God passed over the houses of the Israelites, and only destroyed the firstborn of the Egyptians,
- The Jewish people call this holiday the PASSOVER
- They celebrate this day by having a ceremony called a SEDER, they eat unleavened bread (bread without yeast), called matzoth, they ate this to show they were in a hurry to leave
